organization (OPO) whose purpose is to promote and coordinate the

donation of human organs and tissues for transplantation.

Mission: Lifeline of Ohio's mission is to empower our community to save and heal

lives through organ, eye and tissue donation.

Oversight: Lifeline of Ohio is federally designated by the Centers for Medicare and

Medicaid Services (CMS) of the U.S. Department of Health and Human

Services (HHS) to facilitate the donation process in Central and

Southeastern Ohio and two counties in West Virginia. As a licensed tissue bank, Lifeline of Ohio's tissue recovery services are regulated by the Food and Drug Administration. Lifeline of Ohio is a member of the United Network of Organ Sharing, a government-chartered nationwide network

operating under HHS. (<u>www.unos.org</u>).

Founded: Established in 1985, Lifeline of Ohio is one of four organ procurement

organizations in Ohio.
