# **ABOUT LIFELINE OF OHIO**

Established in 1984, Lifeline of Ohio is an independent, nonprofit organ procurement organization (OPO) whose purpose is to promote and coordinate the donation of human organs, eyes and tissues for transplant. We are designated by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) of the United States Department of Health and Human Services. As a licensed tissue bank, Lifeline of Ohio's tissue recovery services are regulated by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

#### **Mission**

Lifeline of Ohio's mission is to empower our community to save and heal lives through organ, eye and tissue donation.

#### **Vision**

Our vision is a community where every individual embraces organ, eye and tissue donation.

#### **Values**

We value compassion, advocacy, integrity, excellence and collaboration.

- The need for registered donors is urgent.
- Once every 48 hours, an Ohioan dies waiting for a lifesaving organ transplant in the last 10 years, more than 3,500 Ohioans have died waiting.
- Transplantation is the only cure for many life-threatening diseases. Today there are over **105,000 Americans** on the national transplant waiting list and more than 3,200 waiting in Ohio.
- Registering your decision to donate is critical. Last year, over **530 Ohioans donated** organs at the time of their death, resulting in more than 1,700 lifesaving transplants. Organ donation occurs primarily when a person dies on a ventilator, accounting for less than one percent of all deaths.
