ABOUT LIFELINE OF OHIO

Established in 1985, Lifeline of Ohio is an independent, nonprofit organ procurement organization (OPO) whose purpose is to promote and coordinate the donation of human organs, eyes and tissues for transplant. We are designated as an OPO by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. As a licensed tissue bank, Lifeline of Ohio's tissue recovery services are regulated by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

- The need for registered donors is **urgent**.
- Once every 48 hours, an Ohioan dies waiting for a lifesaving organ transplant. In the past 10 years, more than 3,800 Ohioans have died waiting.
- Today, there are over **105,000** men, women and children on the national transplant waiting list, including over 2,700 in Ohio.

 Registering your decision to donate is critical. In 2021, over 630 Ohioans donated organs at the time of their deaths, resulting in more than 1,800 lifesaving transplants.
